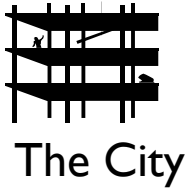

The City

York, known as the "White Rose City" (after the Wars of the Roses—a series of civil wars fought over the throne of England), is located in South Central Pennsylvania. York is home to a variety of large manufacturing companies that provide products and services to markets all around the world. The huge Harley-Davidson motorcycle plant in York employs roughly half of the company's entire production workforce. Also, the smell of chocolate from nearby Hershey, PA, and the complementary aroma from one of only four Starbucks roasting facilities in the world makes this area quite addicting! In addition, even though the area is industrially progressive, York is also historically rich with significant roots in the foundation of our country. The Projects:

5:30 p.m. Dinner
6:30 p.m. Music Team rehearsal or free time
8:00 p.m. Evening program
9:00 p.m. Church group devotions
11:00 p.m. Lights out
